Health Care in Manitoba

- In Canada & MB, the health care system is publicly funded & everyone is eligible for free healthcare
- Basic medical costs are covered with a MB Health Card
- Some costs are <u>not</u> covered with a Health Card
- Some people are eligible for additional supports:
 - EIA, Canada Dental Benefit, Canada Child Benefit, Pharmacare,
 Healthy Baby Prenatal Benefit

Manitoba Health Coverage

MB Health covers basic medical services:

- Medical appointments or clinic visits
- X-ray & laboratory services (e.g. blood tests) ordered by a doctor or nurse practitioner
- Many types of surgery
- Most treatment by specialists
- Hospital care
- Most immunizations
- Home care





Manitoba Health Coverage

MB Health does not cover the cost of:

- Ambulance transportation
- Dental work or orthodontic work
- Eye examinations for those 19-64 years old*
- Eye glasses or contact lenses
- Prescription medications
- Private counselling, physiotherapy, massage...
- Plastic /cosmetic procedures or surgery
- Immunizations for travel





Private Health Care Plans

- Manitoba Blue Cross, Great West Life, & other insurance companies offer a variety of extended health plans for a fee
- Cover a portion of ambulance, dental, prescriptions
 & other health spending
- Some employers provide a supplementary health plan through work
- Eligibility, enrollment periods & monthly costs vary







Eye Care



In Manitoba, if you are:

- <19 years of age or 65+ years, you are entitled to free eye examination every 2 years
- Between 19 64 years, you must pay for eye examinations*
 - Cost ranges from: \$65-\$150

*If you have an eye disease & need an eye specialist (ophthalmologist), eye examinations are covered by Manitoba Health for free regardless of age



Dental Care

- The cost of dental care, orthodontics or dentures are not covered by Manitoba Health
- Dental work can be \$\$\$\$\$
- Lower cost dental programs are available:
 - Health Action Centre
 - Mount Carmel Clinic
 - Deer Lodge Dental Clinic
 - Faculty of Dentistry (University of MB): Dental Clinic
 - Children's Dentistry Clinic
 - SMILE Plus Children's Dental Clinic

Family Doctor

- Consistent care over time
- Maintains your health record, manages your medical conditions & medications
 - e.g. diabetes, asthma
- Offers complete physical examinations
- Provides routine immunizations
- Refers you to a specialist when needed
- Appointments are required

Walk-in Connected Care Clinics (WICCC)

- For minor health issues
- Offer extended hours, including weekends
- First come, first serve basis
- Wait times vary
- Staffed by nurses & nurse practitioners (NPs):
 - can diagnose & treat most minor health issues: e.g. bladder infections, asthma, diabetes...
 - prescribe medications / refer to specialists as needed

Walk-In Clinics

- For minor issues & illness
- No appointments needed
- Some clinics allow booking appointment in advance
- First come, first served
- Wait times vary

Urgent Care Centres

- Open 24/7, 3 locations in Winnipeg:
 - No appointment necessary
 - For non life-threatening medical concerns requiring immediate care: fractures, minor injuries, illness
 - There is usually a long wait time
 - People are seen based on priority of their condition





Emergencies

 Serious conditions that require emergency department treatment:

- Heart attack or stroke
- Major trauma (e.g. car accident)
- Severe head injury
- Amputation
- Extreme difficulty breathing (e.g. allergic reaction or other cause)
- Sexual assault / domestic violence
- Severe bleeding or any time a person is unconscious
- Patients are seen based on the how critical their issue is:
 - Long waits are common

The less severe the condition, the longer the wait

Emergency Departments

- Emergency Departments: open 24/7
- Call 911, or attend nearest emergency department
 - Outside of Winnipeg, 911 will direct you to nearest emergency department
- In Winnipeg: 4 Emergency Departments
 - Health Sciences Centre Emergency: 700 William Ave.
 - Children's Hospital Emergency: 700 William Ave.
 - St. Boniface Hospital: 409 Tache Ave.
 - Grace Hospital: 300 Booth Dr.

Mental Health Emergencies:

- Mental Health Emergencies (Winnipeg):
 - Call (204) 940-1781 or attend Crisis Response Centre
 - Located at 817 Bannatyne Ave.
 - Mobile Crisis Unit can speak directly to the person in crisis by phone (or attend residence / location of person as able*)
- Team of mental health professionals 24/7:
 - Assist individuals in Winnipeg region
 experiencing mental health crisis in need of immediate help
 - e.g. suicidal, hallucinations



Mental Health Support

- Help is available for Ukrainians requiring mental health / substance use support from Klinic
- Free care to those in need within 1 business day:
 - Services include: brief intervention, crisis response, outreach, mental health services, substance use treatment, trauma counselling & help with connecting to formal systems
 - In person & virtual service



Eye Emergencies

- For those experiencing urgent eye problems:
 - e.g. foreign object in eye, injury or chemical burn to eye, sudden visual impairment
- Can attend Misericordia Health Centre:
 - Open 24 /7
 - 99 Cornish Ave (Entrance)
 - (204) 788-8200 Health Links



Prenatal / Pregnancy Care

- Medical care during your pregnancy is free in Manitoba
- Can choose a doctor or a midwife for prenatal care
- Prenatal Care:
 - 1 visit per month 12-28 weeks
 - every 2 weeks 28- 36 weeks
 - once per week until you give birth
- Healthy Baby and Healthy Start groups:
 - Prenatal
 - Birth to 1 year
 - Healthy Baby Prenatal Benefit





Postpartum Care

- Hospital stay after delivery is ~ 1-3 days
- Routine medical follow-up with the doctor or midwife after birth:
 - ~6 weeks for mothers
 - ~2 weeks for baby
- Public Health Nurses offer a home visit in the 1st week to:
 - weigh the baby
 - help with breastfeeding
 - address any concerns you have about yourself or baby
 - offer ongoing support: e.g. postpartum depression

Pharmacy Health Services

- Pharmacists can provide free immunization for Influenza,
 COVID & pneumonia
- Other immunizations may require a prescription
 - e.g. Hepatitis A & B, shingles
 - fee may be charged
- Some pharmacists can assess, diagnose & treat:
 - common minor health issues e.g. urinary tract infections (UTIs),
 head lice, smoking cessation, allergy, some skin conditions
- Extended practice pharmacists can help manage diabetes or geriatric care

Immunizations

- Recommended schedule of routine childhood vaccinations in Manitoba (free)
- Choice to immunize is voluntary
- Children <5 typically receive immunizations at physician offices or well-child clinics in regions outside Winnipeg
- School-aged children are offered immunizations in schools with a parent or guardian's consent
- If you have a vaccine record from Ukraine, call public health office
 & it can be entered into MB system
- Vaccines for travel are <u>not</u> paid for by MB Health

Reproductive Health & Services

- In Canada, individuals have the right to make choices about their sexual & reproductive health
- Laws support individuals to:
 - Have same-sex relations, partners & marriages
 - Identify as being gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender or any other self identification
 - Choose whether or not to become pregnant
 - Terminate a pregnancy (abortion)
 - Divorce or end a relationship
 - Zero tolerance against domestic abuse / violence



Reproductive Health Care & Family Planning

- Different methods of birth control or contraception are available to prevent pregnancy
 - some are free or low cost, others require a prescription / cost \$
- Reproductive health care, sexually transmitted infection testing & information are available through:
 - doctors, clinics, & public health nurses
 - Nine Circles clinic specializes in HIV care
- Women have the choice to decide whether or not to keep a pregnancy
- Pregnancy termination or abortion:
 - available < 20 weeks gestational age in Canada
 - covered by MB Health



Health Care Rights

- In Canada, you have the right to:
 - Choose your own doctor
 - Know the names & credentials of anyone caring for you
 - Provide informed consent for any treatments or care & receive medical treatment without the permission of your spouse
 - Ask questions & view your personal health record
 - Have someone with you during the examination
 - Receive services in your own language & in a way that you understand
 - Accept or refuse treatment / get a second opinion
 - Receive a good standard of care & privacy /confidentiality
 - Be treated with respect
 - Receive health care regardless of your race, age, religion, gender, or sexual orientation

Employment & Income Assistance

- Financial assistance for individuals & families who arrived from Ukraine under CUAET program.
- Program covers costs of basic needs such as:
 - Rent, prescription medications, dental, optical expenses &

employment support.

Pharmacare

- Prescription medications:
 - not covered by MB Health
 - can be expensive \$\$\$



- eligibility is based on income in last 2 years
- must pay 3-7% of your income first (deductible)
- application forms available at most pharmacies:
 - Manitoba Health Provincial Drug Program
 - (204) 786-7141






Federal Dental Benefit

- New Federal Dental Benefit for children:
 - up to \$650/year per child
 - Child < 12yrs of age</p>
 - family income < \$90,000/year</p>
 - apply through Canada Revenue Agency (CRA):

Manitoba Prenatal Benefit

- Benefit to support healthy eating during pregnancy:
 - can receive \$10-\$81 / month
- To apply for this benefit:
 - www.gov.mb.ca/healthychild/healthybaby/
 - (204) 945-1301 or 1(877) 587-6224
 - complete newcomer to Canada form
 - medical note with due date
 - photocopy of arrival papers required

Canada Child Benefit

- The Canada Child Benefit (CCB):
 - monthly tax-free payment made to eligible families to help with the cost of raising children <18 years of age
 - all primary care givers with children <18 are encouraged to apply as there are other benefits you may be eligible for too



Manitoba Law: The Child and Family Services Act, Section 17 (2)(g)

- A parent cannot leave a child < 12 years unattended (without supervision) or caring for younger siblings.
- Important questions to consider if leaving your 12+ year old child alone or caring for younger siblings:
 - Are they comfortable with being alone?
 - Do they know who / how to call for help?
 - Do they have a phone to call for help?

211 Manitoba

- For Ukrainians arriving in Manitoba, help starts with dialing 2-1-1 or by visiting <u>www.mb.211.ca</u>
- Speak to someone who can assist with navigating systems and accessing services
 - Including health, food, housing, mental health, recreation, etc
- 211 phone services:
 - Available 24 hour/day, 7 days/week
 - resources & referrals for newcomers in their home language
 - available in 150 languages, including Ukrainian
