

**FEDERAL PROCEEDS OF CRIME FUND
MANITOBA RECIPIENTS**

The Manitoba government is distributing nearly \$450,000 through the Proceeds of Crime Fund to six Manitoba police agencies for 14 projects that will help combat the illicit drug trade and reduce crime in Manitoba communities.

Brandon Police Service	\$43,100.00	Bicycle Theft Prevention Strategy	Proactive police strategy to reduce victimization and empower residents help fight crimes of opportunity.
Brandon Police Service	\$22,100.00	Project to reduce recidivism rates in Brandon	Reduce crime by assisting those who have committed offences and are being released from jail to secure employment and provide support in maintaining those positions.
RCMP – Portage la Prairie	\$25,000.00	The Portage Hub - new Community Mobilization project	Using professionals to proactively detect harm or risk in individuals or families before it occurs.
RCMP – God’s Lake Narrows	\$12,000.00	Healing Camp program	Voluntary, grassroots program to assist people facing addictions issues. Provides emotional support, and life skills.
RCMP – Thompson Peace and Prevention Committee	\$25,500.00	Community events in Thompson for families and youth at risk, and at risk for gang involved, substance use and sexual exploitation	Reduce youth violence and youth involved crime through interactions and positive intervention.
RCMP – Thompson	\$23,604.00	To utilize the Manitoba Street Reach Team	Locating and returning kids at risk.

Rivers Police Service	\$3,100.00	River Police Cadet Program	Crime prevention through positive, proactive interaction with the police
Springfield Police Service - Chief's Office	\$20,000.00	Springfield Police Service Cadet Program	Crime prevention through positive, proactive interaction with the police.
Winkler Police Service	\$20,000.00	Community Care Program	Improve community safety and invest in families/individuals who are at risk.
Winnipeg Police Service	\$63,900.00	Community-based 'Complex Trauma' videos and facilitation for school aged children (grades 7 to 12)	Increase awareness of 'complex trauma' in kids to help them understand it can lead to alcoholism, drug use, and gang involvement.
Winnipeg Police Service	\$20,000.00	Creation and development of educational videos	To provide sustainable access to resources and support systems to enable youth to avoid and exit gangs.
