Eligible Proponents/Recipients:

- Province of Manitoba;

- public sector body wholly-owned by Manitoba;
- public sector body wholly-owned by a municipal or regional government;
- private sector body, including for-profit organizations and not-for-profit organizations;
- for-profit organizations in collaboration with one or more of the entities above or an Indigenous government; and/or
- Indigenous entities or governments including a band council, First Nation, Inuit or Métis government.

Round One:

Public Transit Infrastructure Stream is based on a public transit ridership model. Eligible proponents under this stream will be contacted directly by the Manitoba Strategic Infrastructure Secretariat.

- Community, Culture and Recreation Infrastructure Stream – Sept. 19; and
