2. Business groups are to provide input to government by January 2021 on how an additional \$50 million could be utilized. The Manitoba Chamber would administer the program.
3. Funding is over two fiscal years and \$149 million has been allocated for 2021-22.
4. Includes approximately \$9 million for 2020-21 for the Job Restart Program. The remaining funds are being repurposed to support the new programs. The Wage Subsidy programs include the Back to Work Manitoba, Back to Work this Summer, and the Summer Student Recovery Jobs and Non-Profit Incentive.
