* Urbain Heroux signed a three-year contract on 15 March 1833 at Three Rivers (A.32/32, fo. 238).

** John McLoughlin Jr. was murdered at Stikine on the night of 20/21 April 1842. Urbain Heroux was accused of the murder and taken to Sitka by Sir George Simpson who turned him over to the Russian authorities, pending investigation into the murder (HBRS VI). Heroux was sent to Fort Vancouver in early 1844 and was then sent to Norway House and, finally, returned to Canada. Proceedings were eventually dropped (HBRS VI).
