He appears as an employee in later records. In the Lac Seul Inspection Report, May 1901, he is described as “Temporary servant, off work, sick”. B.107/e/9

He is also listed in Lac Seul Servants Accounts, 1908-1909. B.107/z/2, fo. 163-167

He signed his surname as McIvor (not McIver) in a monthly fur receipt report at Mattawa Post dated March 31, 1904. McIvor signed himself as “in charge” on this one-page report. B.107/z/2, fo. 13

Louis Romanet’s annual report contains a section on “Wabuskang: Outpost of Lac Seul” which mentions Charles McIver: “But for now, an opposition has set in, the Great Lake Trading Company, with Mr. McIver for Agent.” (p. 26) “The opposition, Mr. McIver, was formerly in charge of a trading outfit for the H.B. Co. at Trout Lake. He operates the two places, Wabuskang and Pine Ridge.” (p. 27) A.92/19/11
