Simpson to Gov. & Com., Lachine, 1 April 1841 (D.4/113, fo. 146)

"Peter Taylor one of the men lately attached to Your Honors Arctic Discovery Expedition died intestate (from starvation & fatigue) while carrying a packet from Messrs. Dease & Simpson to Gt. Slave Lake in the Winter 1837/88. He was a single man & his nearest surviving relatives are an old widowed Mother, three Brothers and four sisters all in the Indian Country except Robert one of the brothers who has been in England since childhood where it is presumed he now is (mate of a Collier belonging either to Shields or Newcastle) but who I am informed has not been heard of by his Relations in Hudsons Bay for the Three past years. There is a balance of £201.15.5 at the credit of the Estate of Peter Taylor..." [details of disposal of estate]
