

* 1850, 24-25 Feb. Refused to go to prayers. Captain Wishart ordered grog because they returned to standing orders. At 00:30 PM served grog and lime juice. Sailors, including James Wishart, William Johnston, Francis Mannock "refused to take their grog; this being reported by me to Captain Wishart he ordered that those men alone who took it should have it in future" The next day "In consequence of bad weather Captain Wishart gave the men another opportunity of taking their grog when it was again refused by those who refused to receive it yesterday with the exception of Francis Mannock" (C.1/613, Log kept by George Holland)
