His retirement in 1903 is said to have been caused by "a temporary breakdown in health following the death of his wife." (A.12/FT 340/4/12, fo.2) Comments about his drinking at this time may be related to this. (D.38/42, fo. 16) In his report, dated 15 February 1913, on the fur trade for the year ending 31 May 1912, Fur Trade Commissioner R.H. Hall wrote: Mr. A.C. McNab, who has been in charge of [James Bay] District for the past three years, is an honourable man of good character but, I would fear, lacking in initiative or decision. He has certainly failed to grapple with the problems which have arisen during his incumbency, and which problems are probably the result of his own lack of personality and power to govern others. He worked under me many years as a Post Manager and in that capacity did not display much ability. He has recently of his own initiative, asked to be relieved of his present charge at the earliest date possible... A.74/21, fo. 25
