\*\* There is some discrepancy in the *Catholic Church Records of the Pacific Northwest* (St. Paul, vols. 1-3) between the senior and junior Thomas Tewatcon. The biographies provided are contradictory, indicating that the senior Thomas was married to Francoise Walla Walla with whom he had two children and then also indicating that the junior Thomas married Francoise and that by the time of the marriage in 1839, the senior Thomas had already died. Likewise, it is not certain whether the employment record is for one or two men. There is a gap between 1827 and 1834 where no Thomas Tewatcon is found in the records. It could be, then, that the Thomas Tewatcon who worked from 1815-1827 is the senior and that the junior Thomas worked from 1834-1845.
