Thomas is mentioned throughout miscellaneous reports on Lac Seul Post, 1902-1909 (B.107/z/2), including a report in "account of supplies furnished by the Hudson's Bay Company to sick and destitute Indians at Lac Seul Post" dated November 28, 1908 in which post manager A. W. Patterson noted of Thomas Young, "This man ran against the line of a spring gun set by another Indian & received the whole charge in his head & face. I extracted 27 pellets of shot from his head & face...[unreadable, perhaps 'fur cap'] saved his life."

Mentioned in 1915 Annual Report, Lake Superior District, by John D. McKenzie, District Manager: "Hudson, on the T.C. Ry. [Railway] is the receiving warehouse for the northern post supplies and is in charge of a half breed, Tom Young, who is quite suitable for the position"	A.74/44, p.81
