1888 Built (D.25/17, fo. 302)

In commission from Athabasca Landing to head of Grand Rapids where goods were transshipped to scow,

taken to Fort McMurray and there transshipped to the Grahame.

It was decided that it would be more efficient to employ scows all the way from Athabasca Landing.
Hauled on the bank at Peace River, Alberta; used as a warehouse by the Hudson's Bay Company.

Hauled to water's edge and set on fire (*The Beaver*, December 1930, p.141).
