for 21 years and had accepted the Company's offer of £22,000 for merchandise, equipment

and the mission ship *Harmony* (A.1/215, fo. 126).

Sailed from Dartmouth, U.K. to Labrador Posts, returning to Ardrossan. Hudson's Bay Company decided to register under name of *Bayharmony*.

1927, April Sold for scrap. The ship breakers, Turner and Hickman of Glasgow, sent figure head to Moravian

Mission in London.
