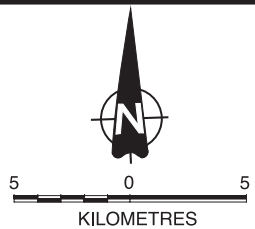
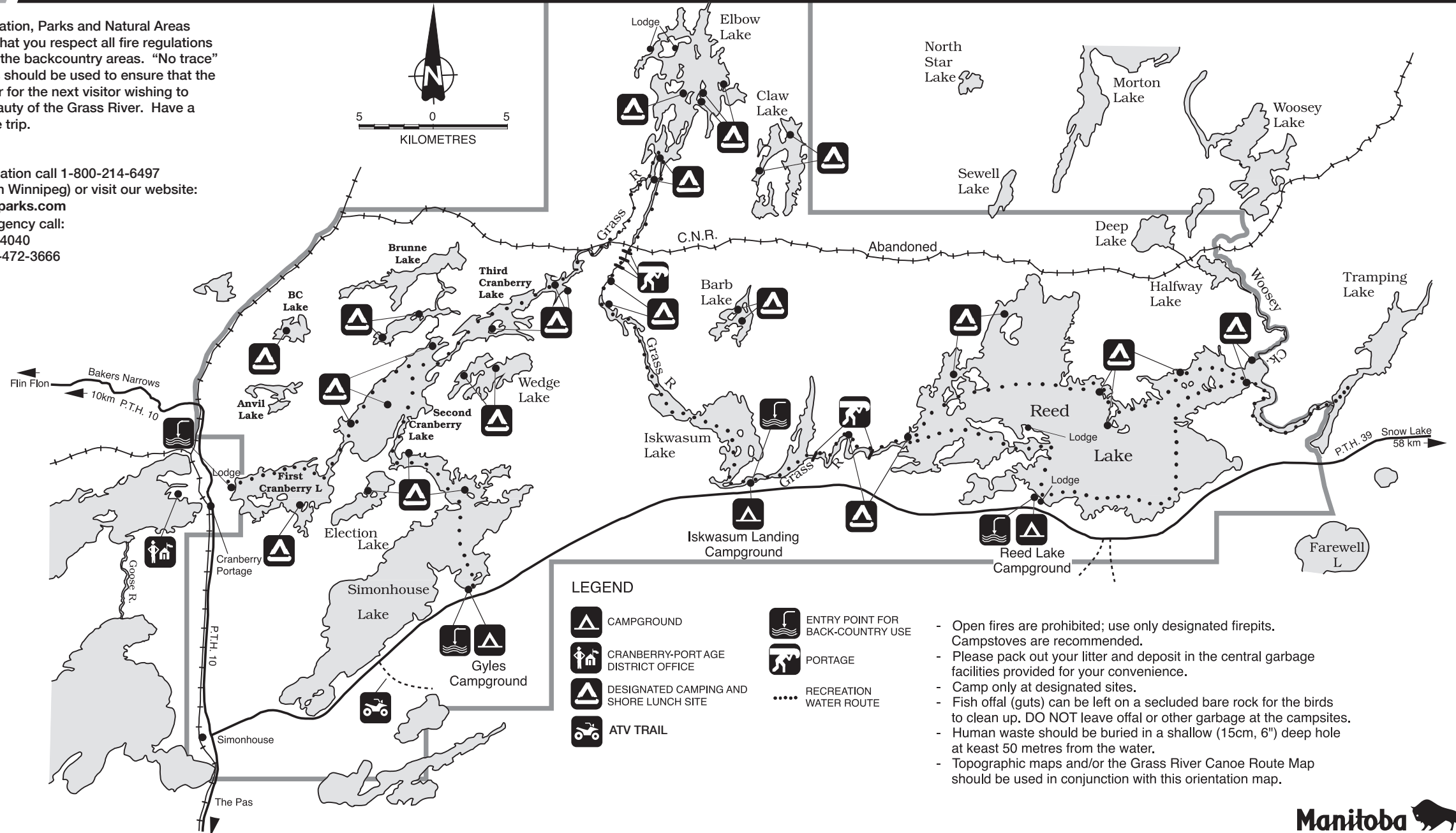

- Open fires are prohibited; use only designated firepits. Campstoves are recommended.
- Please pack out your litter and deposit in the central garbage facilities provided for your convenience.
- Camp only at designated sites.
- Fish offal (guts) can be left on a secluded bare rock for the birds to clean up. DO NOT leave offal or other garbage at the campsites.
- Human waste should be buried in a shallow (15cm, 6") deep hole at least 50 metres from the water.
- Topographic maps and/or the Grass River Canoe Route Map should be used in conjunction with this orientation map.
