Earlier this year, the Department of Education and Early Childhood Learning was established, with an Early Learning and Child Care Division. We have designed a new organizational structure and are growing our team to support the sector and to deliver on the priorities for the early learning and child care system in Manitoba. ### **Staffing Update**

The department would like to welcome the following team members who have joined the Early Learning and Child Care Division over the past three months:

- Susan Emerson, Executive Director of the Provincial Operations Branch: Susan joined the department in September 2022, and was recently successful in a competition to transition into this new portfolio. Susan was previously the Vice-President of Operations at the YMCA-YWCA of Winnipeg, responsible for oversight of their many community programs, including early learning and child care. Susan holds a degree in Developmental Studies from the University of Winnipeg, as well as a Certificate in Adult Education from Red River College, and is certified as an ECE III.

## Moving Forward on Child Care Priorities

Manitoba has signed two federal early learning and child care agreements: the Canada-Wide Agreement and the Canada-Manitoba (Bilateral) Agreement. These two agreements, with a combined investment of almost \$1.3B over the span of 5 years, support a shared commitment to increase the quality, accessibility, affordability, and inclusivity of the early learning and child care system. During this year, many investments have focused on workforce retention and recruitment, capital and space expansion, and affordability.

#### **Consultation and Engagement**

There are several consultative committees that the department supports as part of our work on early learning and child care priorities:

- The Early Learning and Child Care Minister's Consultation Table: This committee is co-chaired by Bonnie Ash and Sarah Whiteford and provides advice and recommendations to the minister.
- The Child Care Parent Advisory Committee: This committee is comprised of a diverse group of parents from across the province who provide advice and recommendations to the minister.
- The Child Care Qualifications and Training Committee: This statutory committee is appointed by the minister and has responsibility for making recommendations on any matter related to the qualifications and training for staff in licensed facilities.

## **Spotlight on Success**

#### Oakville's Dedication to Child Care

Since 2017, Oakville has fundraised \$1.3M for its community's first child care centre. With the influx of families moving to the surrounding areas to pursue rural job opportunities, the community members of Oakville did a survey and the results indicated the strong need for child care. On October 14, 2022, Manitoba and Canada announced the investment of \$1.02M towards Oakville's community centre capital project that will create 40 new child care spaces. Oakville later received an anonymous donation of \$1.0M that has assisted them in exceeding their fundraising goal for their community centre expansion project and new child care centre. Oakville anticipates their new child care facility will be operational by fall 2023.

#### **FCF Tuition Reimbursement**

Manitoba recently launched a tuition reimbursement initiative for students currently enrolled in an ECE training program in the province in the academic years 2021/22 and 2022/23. Students can apply by providing proof of enrollment, completion and tuition paid for each year. Tuition reimbursement is up to a maximum of \$5K per year.
