### Moving Forward on Child Care Priorities

The department has appreciated the sector feedback on the need for more flexible and targeted investments to support inclusive, quality programming and workforce recruitment and retention strategies. In response to these needs, the Manitoba government recently announced new Quality Enhancement Grants: three one-time grant funding streams made available through investments by both Canada and Manitoba.

The Quality Enhancement Grants, totalling \$60 million, are available to licenced non-profit child care centres (including infant, pre-school, nursery and school-aged programs) and all licensed home-based (group/family) facilities:

- Quality Early Learning Environments Grant For Centres and Homes
   \$875 per licensed space Intended to help address aging infrastructure, equipment and materials.
- Enhancing Diversity and Inclusion Grant For Centres and Homes \$500 per licensed space — Intended to help ensure children of all backgrounds and abilities feel a sense of belonging and have the ability to meaningfully participate in the program through enriched curricula, space adaptations, and professional development opportunities for staff.
- Recruitment and Retention Grant For Centres only
   \$200 per licensed space -Intended to help child care centres implement creative and innovative strategies to recruit, retain, and support qualified child care workers and educators.
- Retirement Enhancement and Retention Benefit For Homes only \$500 RRSP top-up -Intended to help provide recognition for home-based license holders for their dedication to the child care sector through a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) top-up.

Eligible facilities will have to opt-in to receive these grants by March 13, 2023. The funding will be disbursed to those who have opted in before mid-April 2023, and facilities will report back on outcomes.

# Spotlight on Success

**Starting Blocks** is a preschool and school age centre located in Stonewall with 26 staff and 150 licensed spaces across three locations.



The Centre's Circle of Security (COS) Facilitator recently implemented the eight-week COS sessions with all staff. This led to the creation of a

new Assistant Director of Staffing / Program Mentor position, with time committed to training and mentoring staff, including teaching COS parenting sessions, funded through the local parent and child coalition.

"It was so beneficial to have a facilitator that worked directly with the children and within the Centre programs to model the COS concepts. We feel more connected to the children we care for and with each other as a team." – Starting Blocks ECE

Starting Blocks reports their staff are even more committed to building secure relationships and supporting children's needs all around the circle. The investment has reduced challenging behaviours and increased security and confidence within the Centre, and they are already observing growth in the children's social skills, peer relationships and expression of emotions.

Introduced to Manitoba in 2018, COS has been integrated as part of the ELCC Inclusion Support Program, providing training to staff to work with children with additional behavioural and emotional support needs focusing on attachment and addressing the reason behind the behaviour not the behaviour itself. Over the last five years, more than 120 COS groups have been completed, including more than 800 participants in the child care sector.
