MANITOBA COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PROGRAM AWARD - APPLICATION

Congratulations on your decision to apply for the Manitoba Community Emergency Preparedness Award. The Manitoba *Emergency Measures Act* requires municipalities to implement emergency preparedness programs and plans to achieve a state of readiness for emergencies and disasters. This award will allow Manitoba EMO to recognize your dedicated efforts and successes.

SCOPE: In the application format to follow, emergency preparedness programs are divided into four levels of achievement based on Canadian and International best practices. The first level – Mandated – is required under Legislation and policy. A community should seek to progressively develop its emergency preparedness program into the comprehensive achievement level. A comprehensive emergency preparedness program is the best way to protect public safety and create disaster-resilient communities, as well as protect public health, the environment, property and economic stability.

Application Instructions: It is recommended that you work with a team (ie your Local Emergency Response Control Group) as you progress through the application. Simply review and discuss your plans and preparedness program to identify what achievement level you currently fall under. Achievement levels may differ depending on the topic. Initial Step (All Achievement Levels)

Because each community has different and distinct hazards and risks, a hazard identification and analysis must be completed for each community. Hazards (what can occur) include natural, technological and human-caused events. The analysis determines how often these hazards occur and how severe the effects could be on public safety. In general terms, this is often understood as probability of occurrence, consequence or impact, and vulnerability. The results of this step will assist in confirming priorities and how the emergency preparedness program should be developed for the community.
