

FILING PROVINCIAL TAX RETURNS DURING A POSTAL DISRUPTION

With a mail strike possible by September 26, 2018, the September 2018 Retail Sales Tax (RST), Health and Education Levy (HE) and International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA) tax returns will be advance-mailed.

While the impact of this action on mail delivery service is unknown at this time, please be advised that **the due dates for all provincial tax returns do not change in the event of a strike**. For example, September RST returns are due October 22, 2018, September HE returns are due October 15, 2018 and IFTA third quarter returns are due October 31, 2018.

To ensure that your RST and HE returns and payments are filed on time, you are encouraged to **file and pay your returns online using our TAXcess service at manitoba.ca/TAXcess**. As of Oct 1, 2018, IFTA returns can also be filed and paid online using our TAXcess service.

A postal disruption is just one more reason you should make the switch to TAXcess, our online tax service that allows you to file, pay and view your Manitoba business tax accounts online wherever and whenever you want. It's simple, secure and available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Corporation Capital Tax, Fuel and Tobacco Tax returns must be received at one of the Taxation Division offices above by their respective due dates. Payments relating to Corporation Capital and Fuel taxes can be made securely on-line through TAXcess.
