If you are a professional, new to Canada, you probably have a lot of questions about how to have your qualifications recognized so that you can start working in your field.





Your regulatory body is the most reliable and up to date source of information.

Family and friends
are a great source of support,
but you should not rely on
them for information about
what you need to do
to get licensed.



They may have information that is old or incorrect.

Even other internationally educated professionals, who have already completed the registration process, may not have the most current information.



Processes are always changing and are very detailed.

Your particular situation may be different from others entering or practicing your profession.



Plan to learn about and prepare for your specific registration pathway.

This will help you avoid out-of-date and inaccurate information.

Visit your regulator's website and look for headings such as:



Internationally Educated Applicants



If you cannot find answers to your questions on your regulator's website, contact them directly.

Staff should be available to help you either by phone, email or in-person.



Look for a **Frequently Asked Questions** (FAQ) page on your regulator's website.
