

PRE-SCREENING ASSESSMENT FOR IN-PERSON VISITS

This pre-screening assessment must be completed by department staff prior to any in-person visit with program participants or staff. One pre-screening assessment must be completed per visit. Families, staff or operators must respond to the questions with all household members (for in-home visits) or all attendees (for day service visits) in mind, including staff (if applicable).

In the past 14 days, has anyone in the household or day service (including staff, if applicable):

1. Returned from travel outside of Manitoba, excluding travel to Western Canada, the Territories or Ontario west of Terrace Bay without an exemption?

2. Had close contact (i.e., within two metres/six feet for more than 15 minutes without the use of personal protective equipment) with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19?
3. Been directed to self-isolate?
4. Had new onset of any one of the following symptoms associated with COVID-19?
 - fever/chills
 - cough
 - sore throat/hoarse voice
 - shortness of breath/breathing difficulties
 - loss of taste or smell
 - vomiting or diarrhea for more than 24 hours

5. Had new onset of any two of the following symptoms associated with COVID-19?
 - runny nose
 - muscle aches
 - fatigue
 - conjunctivitis (pink eye)
 - headache
 - skin rash of unknown cause
 - poor feeding (if an infant)
 - nausea
 - loss of appetite

If the answer is “no” to all of the questions, the visit may proceed with the appropriate use of personal protective equipment (PPE).

If the answer is “yes” or “unsure” to any of the questions, department staff must contact their supervisor/resource coordinator for direction prior to the visit. Depending on the reason for the visit, the department staff may be directed to conduct the visit with the appropriate use of PPE.
