The government of Manitoba and Public Health have recently implemented the new colour-coded system to allow government to roll out COVID-19 restrictions targeting specific regions, communities or industries in the province.

Following the report of recent new cases in the Winnipeg capital region (see list below), Public Health has elevated the region to the "Restricted (orange) level" which places further public health restrictions on the region.

The added restrictions relate only to public gathering sizes, which will be reduced to 10 people both indoors and outdoors, and **mandatory mask use** by adults and children aged five and older at all times in indoor public locations, as well as at any public gatherings.

This means that all department staff, service providers, clients/participants and visitors are required to wear a mask in all publicly accessible office spaces such as reception areas, elevators, meeting rooms, lunch rooms and any public space where services are provided. Staff are also **strongly encouraged** to wear a mask at their own desks when talking or working with another person if physical distancing cannot be maintained.

Staff providing care to CLDS participants are to continue to follow current PPE guidelines provided by the Department of Families.

According to the Public Health Order issued on September 28, 2020, CLDS participants attending day services in Winnipeg capital region are required to wear a mask and to follow Public Health directives for wearing masks. Exceptions are permitted if a disability or other health concern prevents a participant from safely wearing a mask or if a participant is unable to put on or remove a mask without assistance. Participants are not required to wear masks while in their own homes.

People can also temporarily remove their mask while in an indoor public place to:

- receive a service that requires the removal of their mask;
- consume food or drink;
- deal with an emergency or medical purpose; or
- establish their identity.

Despite the restrictions on public gathering sizes and mandatory mask use in indoor public spaces, service delivery in the Department of Families remains at the "Caution (yellow) level" and no additional restrictions are in place in services being delivered in Winnipeg and surrounding area.

As part of its response to COVID-19, Manitoba Families is distributing reusable masks to its clients, beginning in the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority. This will include two reusable masks for every adult in the household. In total, more than 227,000 reusable masks will be distributed across the province in the coming weeks.

The department will work closely with Public Health who will be assessing the situation and advising the department on next steps should their direction change.
