Position Overview

Manitoba Infrastructure has embarked on a service delivery modernization initiative to introduce best practices in capital planning and delivery and to enhance Manitoba's transportation and water infrastructure network. Over the next ten years, Manitoba will be recognized as an international transportation hub, linking east to west, north to south and enabling strong economic activity within and across our borders to: enhance transportation mobility and connectivity; ensure safety and reliability across the highway network; enable industry expansion that leverages Manitoba's diverse economy; and build climate resiliency.

As a member of the department's executive management team, the Assistant Deputy Minister is responsible to lead and manage the division, provide advice and support to the Deputy Minister, and contribute to achieving the corporate goals of government through cross-department initiatives.

Provides executive leadership and strategic direction to a diverse portfolio of projects across the department to support achievement of the department's objectives and outcomes.

Oversees the execution of a capital infrastructure budget exceeding \$600 million per year and accountable for overall capital planning, project management and innovation in capital delivery.

The Assistant Deputy Minister will:

- Deliver on department commitments related to completion of scheduled capital infrastructure projects.
- Lead long-term capital planning across a diverse range of asset classes and align the capital plan to cross-departmental capital investment planning and fiscal goals.
- Lead the development of innovative approaches to capital delivery methods, in-house skills development and training and project management methodology.
- Build a respectful workplace culture that promotes diversity, learning and continuous improvement. Coach and mentor the management team and support individual and team development.
- Lead the development of strategic objectives, financial and business plans and operating principles for the division that are consistent with government direction, department goals and

public expectations; evaluate outcomes and ensure all legal and reporting requirements are met.

- Direct the management of the human and financial resources of the division to deliver on operational and strategic mandates, ensuring the appropriate allocation of resources to maximize efficiency. Monitor and control expenditures and develops plans for future human and financial resource needs.
- Develop relationships with internal, cross department and external stakeholders; lead crossdepartment and corporate initiatives; represent the interests of the department in federal, provincial and territorial initiatives and discussions.
- Support the deputy minister by providing strategic options, comprehensive policy advice and recommendations using internal and external expertise. Provide briefings and advice to the minister and Cabinet.

To meet these responsibilities, the department delivers a wide range of programs and services that play a critical role in sustaining the contributions of the transportation sector to Manitoba's economic growth.

Manitoba Infrastructure's transportation responsibilities include corporate policy and provincial legislation development, motor carrier safety and regulation enforcement, carrier permits and the development and implementation of sustainable transportation initiatives.

The department's water control, drainage and transportation infrastructure management duties cover the construction, maintenance, and operation of 19,000 kilometres of all weather roads, 2,200 kilometres of winter roads, over 21,000 bridges and culverts, 4,700 kilometres of drains, 75 dams, 61 reservoirs, 41 pumping stations, 24 northern airports, and many other components.
