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The notes under tariff 7104 have been amended effective December 1, 2025.

7104 Screening Mammography, bilateral 35.19

Note: *Tariff 7104 is payable:*

- a) *where the service is requested for an asymptomatic female aged 45 years and over;*
- b) *where the service is provided by CancerCare Manitoba's BreastCheck Program (BreastCheck) in one of their designated permanent or mobile facilities; and*

- c) only once within **any** twenty-four month period in respect of each qualifying patient, unless authorized by a representative of BreastCheck.

Note: “Asymptomatic” female means a person who has not had breast cancer, or does not have signs or symptoms of breast cancer, such as a palpable lump, nipple changes or discharge, or breast changes indicating potential breast cancer.

An asymptomatic female with a significant family history or a significant personal history of breast cancer is eligible for either a screening mammography or a diagnostic mammography ([tariffs 7098](#) and [7099](#)) as determined by a physician’s requisition or by a representative of BreastCheck.

“Significant family history” means a greater than 25% lifetime risk of developing breast cancer based on the Claus Model or another risk model identified by a representative of BreastCheck.

“Significant personal history” means a female with a history of total body or chest radiation; lobular carcinoma in-situ, atypical ductal hyperplasia, or atypical lobular hyperplasia; or a confirmed BRCA gene mutation.

Note: “Female” means a biological female at birth, a transgender female who has taken gender-affirming hormones for five years or more, or a transgender male who still has breast tissue.
