Dear Ms. «MotherName»

Your baby, born on «BabyDOB» , was given the first dose of hepatitis B vaccine in the hospital. This vaccine is given to prevent Hepatitis B. Hepatitis B is an infection of the liver, which can be serious.

Two more doses of the vaccine are needed. Some babies need three more doses if they were born early.

Please make two appointments with your baby's regular health care provider for the baby to get these two needles. The first appointment should be when your baby is one month old. The second appointment should be when the baby is six months old.

Your health care provider may recommend that your child have a blood test after all the vaccine doses have been given. This blood test will let you and your doctor know if your child is protected against hepatitis B virus.
