Influenza (Flu)	All Manitobans 6 months of age and older are eligible for influenza vaccine each year. People aged 65 years and older are eligible for an enhanced influenza vaccine.										

◆ = A single vaccine dose given.

● = Tdap vaccine is available for adults who are due for their tetanus booster and pregnant individuals in every pregnancy between 27 and 32 weeks gestation.

\* Infants born between October 1, 2025 and March 31, 2026 are eligible for one dose of the RSV monoclonal antibody.

\*\* Children with high-risk medical conditions and those living in First Nations communities should be immunized with Pneumococcal Conjugate 20 valent (Pneu-C-20) at 2, 4, 6 and 18 months. \*\*\* As of March 1, 2024, a meningococcal vaccine that protects against four strains is offered as part of the Immunization Schedule for Infants and Pre-School Children. Those with certain high-risk medical conditions may require additional doses.
