## SURVEILLANCE OF OPIOID MISUSE AND OVERDOSE IN MANITOBA JANUARY 1 – MARCH 31, 2018

The "increasing" and "decreasing" trends indicated by the arrows ( $\downarrow$  /  $\uparrow$ ) refer to the change from updated 2017 fourth quarter numbers.

Given the increasing concerns of harm associated with opioid misuse and overdose in Manitoba, a surveillance system was established in the beginning of 2017 by collaborating with a range of stakeholders. To date, a baseline report and five quarterly reports have been publicly released. The number of naloxone kits shipped from the Materials Distribution Agency increased by 20% since the last quarter. Overdoses reported through the take-home naloxone program also increased by 27%. Based on available data, as of the first quarter of 2018, 18 apparent-opioid related deaths occurred in Manitoba. Amongst these deaths, fentanyl-related opioids (including its analogs) were present in 4 deaths (carfentanil was reported in one death). Apparent-opioid related deaths in 2017 was also revised following a final chart review: 192 drug-related deaths occurred in 2017, 106 (55%) were opioid related. The number of Manitobans dispensed a prescription for opioids, has also slightly declined (2%) since the last quarter. Manitoba continues to work closely with regional, provincial, and national stakeholders to improve prescription opioid monitoring, public awareness and education, prevention and harm reduction, and mental health and addiction treatment services.
