Through the support of Healthy **Child Manitoba Bookmates** provides program training to community members and program staff in order to implement and adapt the program to their specific local challenges. This training is offered in the community increasing accessibility, particularly for rural areas.

Alphabet Soup goes National

Families across Canada are enjoying Alphabet Soup as a result of Bookmates' Literacy in Action project (supported by OLES) which brought facilitator training to seven communities. Partnerships from this project continue and currently Bookmates is working with Health Canada and Aboriginal Head start programs in eastern Canada and Ontario. Prince Albert SK now offers Alphabet Soup through their community schools to parents and children entering the school system.

Assessment of outcomes for this type of programming is difficult, but an important next step in Bookmates' commitment to best practice in this field.
