Safety and security committee

As a Manitoba Housing tenant, you are invited to become a member of a safety and security committee to act as a information liaison between tenants in your community and Manitoba Housing staff, law enforcement and security professionals regarding safety and security issues.

Why become a committee member?

- You can address safety and security concerns in your community.
- You can help make important changes in your community.
- You can help set safety and security priorities.

What do tenant committee members do?

Tenant committee members present concerns and work together with Manitoba Housing staff, security professionals and law enforcement to improve safety and security for everyone. They report back to the tenants about what the committee is doing to resolve safety and security concerns.

Manitoba Citizens on Patrol

Manitoba Citizens on Patrol are community crime-prevention groups who stay on the lookout for any suspicious or criminal activity in their communities and report it to the police. Patrol members act as a deterrent to criminals by providing a presence in the community through volunteer patrols.
