## What's new?

The Manitoba Geological Survey is updating the geological highway map of Manitoba. First published in 1987 and re-released in 1994, and now out-of-print, this map was ready for an update.

The map will have a brand new 1:1,000,000 scale geological base that will be scalable to 1:250,000 in some digital versions. With a new modern layout, it will be easier to use, smaller in size and more versatile. It will be available in many forms, including paper, PDF and a dedicated website.

It will include new points of interest with particular focus on sites in parks, along the roadside and in public spaces, all making it easy to see and enjoy Manitoba's rich geological landscape.

A series of complementary products will also be available that will outline the geological history of Manitoba through the eras. Perfect for personal or classroom use.
