





We have experienced just about every problem imaginable in our attempts to get the captioned test well underway. Modifications had to be made to the drilling rig and some of the necessary equipment took longer to obtain from suppliers than we anticipated. Then the equipment was delayed several days in The Pas due to a derailment up the line toward Churchill. However, the greatest problem has been weather. We have had very little flying weather in the northern area during the last three weeks. Our report today from Midwest Drilling was that four Otters loaded with fuel have been waiting at Ilford for one week unable to take off because of weather. However, the rig is on location and there is a possibility the well has spudded. Our radio contact with the location has been poor, however Midwest expects better contact will be established soon.

We bring our problem to your attention because of the permit terms and the November 2, 1968 deadline. Can we expect any tolerance from your department in the event we have not completed our drilling operation and furnished cost data by that date. Please advise us as to the Department's feelings on this matter.

As you are doubtless aware, Section 101 of the Cil and Natural Gas Regulations provides that:

a hole is completed, the licensee shall deliver to the Branch in proper containers all cores recovered from such holes, whether drilled for seismograph surveying, structure mapping or for any other purpose."

However, we realize that you will wish to examine core obtained from the Houston et al Comeault Prov. No. 1 (STH) well.

In order to achieve the objective of the above section, which is to retain the core as a permanent record and at the same time permit an examination by your geologists, we suggest the following procedure: That, immediately on the completion of drilling, all core be forwarded to Dr. K. A. Phillips, Assistant Director of Mines, Room 900 Norquay Building, Winnipeg 1, Menitoba. Our staff and probably a representative of the Geological Survey of Canada would, as quickly as possible, examine the core without taking samples, following which it would be forwarded to you in Calgary. We suggest that your sampling of the core should be limited to slabbing not more than one foot of every 10 feet of the core and the removal of the minimum number of fossils necessary for paelontological study. Fossil samples, after examination, would be forwarded to the Geological Survey of Canada at Calgary for permanent storage. After the examination and sampling have been completed, and not more than one year after completion of drilling, the

remainder of the core would be forwarded to the Mines Branch in Winnipeg for permanent storage.

Houston Oils acquired the above captioned permits which are located in Northern Manitoba from your Government on February 2, 1967. During August of 1967, we sent in a crew which carried out a gravity survey. Although this was a reconnaissance type survey we did locate one large anomaly which appeared to the geophysicist who did the interpretation to be. in sediment overlying the basement rocks.

After considerable deliberation we decided to attempt drilling this anomaly by using a mining type diamond drill which could be flown into the location by float plane. Using this type drill we could cut a continuous core through the sediment into the Precambrian which would give us an excellent evaluation of the test well.

We decided to proceed with this operation in early July in hope we would be able to get the test soudded early in August. Our operations have been plagued with trouble from the start. We are attaching a letter we wrote to Mr. Roper setting out just some of the troubles we have encountered.

As of this writing we have set surface casing into bedrock and we are drilling ahead below 250 feet. If we have no serious problems in drilling we should have this test drilled into basement by November 20, 1968.

Since our permits were dated February 2, 1967, our first eighteen months period was up on August 2, 1968. However, your department, through Mr. J. S. Richards, agreed to waive the normal deposit due for the second period of the permits, if we would get all of our well costs in before November 2, 1968, to establish our credits. Of course, this is now impossible

due to the delayed drilling. Therefore, on this date we are depositing \$60,000.00 with the Department which is only sufficient to cover the deposit on 400,000 acres of our 689,000 black. The \$60,000.00 deposit is made since this is our estimated cost on the test well.

grant double credits to the permit expenditures if we can drill the test 100 feet into basement. Since the cost will be approximately \$60,000.00, the expenditure credit would be \$120,000.00. This would have the effect of extending all permit acreage for the second permit period.

We have asked the Department not to terminate the permits on which we have not made the fifteen cents per acre deposit. We need just a little time to get the test drilled, if possible, and apply the drilling cost credits to these permits. We feel you have this right under Section 278. (1). All we need is three or four weeks, however, both Mr. Richards and Mr. Roper feel they do not have authority to grant this additional time under the regulations. Therefore, we respectfully request that you do not terminate these permits so that we might hold the balance of the permit acreage until we determine if the test well can be drilled into the basement.

Points in favor of Minister granting a time extension

- (1) Geological information to basement may be of considerable economic value to Province.
- (2) Geological information to basement will be of great technical interest to Geology



- (3) We do not doubt this Company's desire to conform to regulations. Apparently the Company has limited resources and has encountered unusual operational delays in his attempts to make good his November 2nd commitments.

Points against Minister granting a time extension

- (1) I feel the Department has been most generous in the interpretation of the Regulations by permitting Houston to operate from Aug. 2nd to date without full depositing the amount required in Sec. (247) (1) (\$103,350.00).
- (2) The \$60,000 Promissory note deposited with the Department covers the deposit required for 400,000 acres Normally the Company should be required to designate the area covered by this deposit when the deposit is made. In this case, an early area election is most desirable.
- (3) My personal opinion is that we have erred in permitting Houston to retain the permits past Aug. 2 without depositing the required amount. To perpetuate this delay will render the regulations difficult of application.
- (4) City Savings & Trust are presently in a similar situation. They should have made their deposit by Nov. 10. During a telephone conversation this morning, and partially due to the Nov. 11 holiday, I permitted them an extension on the understanding that they have their deposit in the airmail today enroute to the department.

Recommendations

- (1) That Houston Oils be denied an extension of time in their endeavor to retain all of the 689,000 acres covered in 0 & N.G. Permits No. 36 to 46.
- (2) That Houston Oils be permitted to retain their choice of 400,000 acres of the 689,000 acres, provided that they meet all the requirements of the Regulations in so far as the drilling of the D.D. hole 100' into basement and submit expenditures under statutory declaration, OR by forfeiture of the \$60,000 deposit.
- (3) If the minister wishes to grant retention of more than 400,000 acres beyond the Nov. 2 deadline we respectfully recommend that from now on he will expect the Department to devise methods by which the Regulations may be adhered to.



Your company recently put down a bore hole, Houston Mo. 1, in the Mudson Bay area, which ponetrated the Palaeosoic rocks. Samples from the Precembrian basement have been accurately dated by one of our geologists using the Rb/Sr technique. In the same vicinity a hole drilled by Aquitaine also cored basement and these samples too have been analyzed.

The age of the basement rocks from this area is of great significance and relevance to the shield in that it solves the problem of the location of the Churchill-Superior boundary 250 miles to the southwest. All this work is, of course, confidential, in the case of the Houston hole for approximately 2 years, but the Aquitaine results will be open shortly. We would like to release both these results in the form of a scientific paper to be published, probably in the Canadian Journal of Earth Sciences, and we are seeking your company's permission to do so. There are three age determinations from the Houston hole. The results are in the final calculation stages and would, of course, be made available to you in the first instance.

Enclosed are the results of age determinations on basement cores from the Kaskattama and Houston wells.

The indicated ago, 1975 ± m.y. is typical of the Churchill Province. (The + here is the 95% confidence interval, approximately 2 standard deviations). Generally Rb-Sr results are about 5% higher than corresponding K-Ar ages because of the docay constant used. One of the advantages of the whole rock Rb-Sr method is the possibility of inference of the genetic origin of the rocks based on the value of the initial Sr composition. Thus in this work the low value for the initial Sr/85sr, 0.7018 ± 0.0005, points to a deep crustal source for the material and precludes the possibility of the age determinations registering a metamorphic ovent. In contrast K-Ar ages on minerals register the last event.

I am most grateful for the permission to publish these results and hope they are of practical significance to your organization.



As you are doubtless aware, Section 101 of the Oil and Natural Gas Regulations provides that:

"101. Within one year from the time a hole is completed, the licensee shall deliver to the Branch in proper containers all cores recovered from such holes, whether drilled for seismograph surveying, structure mapping or for any other purpose."

However, we realize that you will wish to examine core obtained from the Houston et al Comeault Prov. No. 1. (STH) well.

In order to achieve the objective of the above section, which is to retain the core as a permanent record and at the same time permit an examination by your geologists, we suggest the following procedure: That, immediately on the completion of drilling, all core be forwarded to Dr. K. A. Phillips, Assistant Director of Hines, Room 900 Norquay Building, Winnipeg 1, Manitoba. Cur staff and probably a representative of the Geological Survey of Canada would, as quickly as possible, examine the core without taking samples, following which it would be forwarded to you in Calgary. We auggest that your sampling of the core should be limited to slabbing not more than one foot of every 10 feet of the core and the removal of the minimum number of fossils necessary for paciontological study. Fossil samples, after examination, would be forwarded to the Geological Survey of Canada at Calgary for permanent storage. After the examination and sampling have been completed, and not more than one year after completion of drilling, the

remainder of the core would be forwarded to the Mines Branch in Winnipeg for permanent storage.

We have tentatively approved this well as eligible for double credits, based on your representation that a core hole will provide all useful information. Should the core which is eventually forwarded to Winnipeg be such that this is not so, we would be obliged to reconsider this approval.

With regard to disposition of the core for the above well, this matter has been discussed with Mr. Derek Gould, who I believe is no longer associated with Houston Oils. Mr. Gould had indicated that he would forward this core to Winnipeg so that we would be able to examine the core prior to shipment to Calgary. This letter is to request confirmation of this arrangement and to state our reasons for requesting same.

As you undoubtedly know, the Mines Act (Section 101) states that "Within one year from the time a hole is completed the licensee shall deliver to the Branch in proper containers all cores recovered from such holes". Normally this means that the core is examined by the company and subsequently delivered to the Branch. However, in view of what happened with the core for the only other oil well test in the Hudson Bay area, the Kaskattama #1 hole, we are requesting that the core be submitted to the Branch for preliminary examination before being sent to Calgary. We appreciate the fact that a certain amount of sampling (fossils, core analyses, etc.) must be done, especially in such a virgin exploration area, but in the case of the Kaskattama hole, the core was halved (with our permission) for microfossil studies, and in addition a large number of fossil samples were taken and the core was badly broken up in the process. The fossil samples were eventually forwarded to the G.S.C. at Calgary for permanent storage, again with our permission. However, the net result was that the core as eventually received at the Mines Branch was only poorly representative of the hole. For this reason, we are requesting the core be shipped to Winnipeg (Geology Division, Room 900 Norquay Building) prior to examination at Calgary. We would examine it as quickly as possible here and would not remove any samples at this time. All information will of course be retained confidential for a period of 2 years after completion of the hole.

In any case, we will require that all core, except for fossil samples, eventually be returned to the Mines Branch within the one year limit. As in the case of the Kaskattama core hole, we will require that all fossil samples be turned over to the Geological Survey of Canada for permanent storage at Calgary. (If necessary, a maximum of 10% of the core can be slabbed for sampling; 1 foot every 10 feet.)

I hope that the above arrangements will meet with your approval. Please advise if you have any alternative suggestions in this regard.

I should also add that Dr. Bruce Sanford of the G.S.C. is currently carrying out a detailed study of the Palaeozoic formations in the Hudson Bay area, and he would be very interested in examining the complete core for the Comeault S.T.H. I believe that he is writing you in this regard. If you do grant Dr. Sanford permission to examine the core, he could possibly do this in Winnipeg at the same time we are examining the core.



The following comments are made relative to your request that the 15 cents per acre deposit required August 2, 1968, with respect to the above permits, be waived.

As you have mentioned, subsection (1) of Section 278 of the Regulations provides that the deposit may be made "within ninety days after the date on which the deposit is to be made, ...". If you commence drilling as stated in your letter of July 15, 1968, and if you submit the statement of expenditures required by Section 251, verified by a statutory declaration, within the ninety-day period, we will consider this equivalent to the posting of a deposit equal to the expenditures listed in this statement. Should these expenditures be less than the 20 cents per acre deposit required for the first and second periods, the difference may be made by a deposit as set out in Section 247.
