# **Community Overview**

Aghaming is one of a group of four in a 16 kilometre (km) square area. The Hollow Water reserve, known as Wanipigow, lies at the center with Aghaming to the northeast, Seymourville to the west and Manigotagan to the southwest.

#### Access

Aghaming is located on the eastern shore of Lake Winnipeg, 70 km north of Powerview-Pine Falls and accessible by the main market road heading northeast of Seymourville.

#### Governance

Aghaming is represented by a contact person and defined as a settlement under The Northern Affairs Act.

## **Economic Overview**

Aghaming is located within the Precambrian Shield region of Manitoba, an area of granite-gneissic rock with little or no soil cover. Land within the immediate vicinity is clay with rock outcroppings supporting softwood and hardwood forest cover.

Economic activity includes fishing, hunting, trapping and pulpwood logging. Trapping is organized under the Hole River and Lac du Bonnet Registered Trapline (RTL) zones which are shared with nearby communities.


