Barrows is the approximate centre of a group of five including Baden, Powell, National Mills and Red Deer Lake. Close by is the Westgate cottage area. Barrows is the largest community of the group and provides services to the area.

Access

Barrows is located on Provincial Trunk Highway (PTH) 77 between Mafeking and the Manitoba-Saskatchewan border. The highway is the approximate northern boundary of the Porcupine Provincial Forest.

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act and first recognized as a community in 1984.

The community employs a community administrative officer, public works employee, regional community safety officer, volunteer fire chief and a regional recreation director.

Economic Overview

Barrows originated in the 19th century when the Red Deer Lake Sawmill was in operation. The mill was closed in 1927 and since that time several small sawmills have operated for short periods of time. The area is heavily forested and forest harvesting continues to provide some employment with saw logs for some mills. Local soils have potential for agricultural development and there is limited ranching.

Trapping continues to be a major source of employment and the community shares traplines in the Porcupine and Shoal River Registered Trapline Zones with other communities.

Water and Wastewater

Water is provided by two local wells. The water is treated through a reverse osmosis process, chlorinated and then piped to residences.

Sewage is piped from residences to a three cell sewage lagoon located near the community.

Other liquid waste is collected by a pumpout truck and deposited in the lagoon.

Waste Disposal

A waste disposal site is located 2 kilometres west of the community on PTH 77. This is a regional site supervised and open 12 hours per week. Waste is picked up weekly by the public works employee.
