The community adjoins the independent Berens River reserve and lies on provincial Crown land. Information in this profile refers to the non-reserve side, unless otherwise noted.

Access

The community is located along the eastern shore of Lake Winnipeg at the mouth of the Berens River. It is 292 kilometres north of Winnipeg by air. There are currently only winter road, barge and air linkages to the community.

Governance

The community was first recognized in 1970 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Water and Wastewater

Two basic water supply systems have been installed to provide potable water to the community on both sides of Berens River. Water pumped from Lake Winnipeg is filtered, chlorinated and distributed to pressurized standpipes. Some homes on the south side are directly connected to the distribution system. The reserve water system is independent of the community system. Sewage is hauled by pump-out truck to a sewage lagoon located on the reserve, north of the river.

Waste Disposal

Solid waste is trucked to a disposal site on the reserve.

Schools

Frontier School Division operates the Berens River School located on the reserve, a consolidated school for both community and on reserve students. The school serves 299 students from Nursery to Grade 9. There is a principal, 23 teachers and eight or more support staff. Phone: 204-382-2153.
