Dauphin River

Community Overview

Two closely related and adjoining communities share the name Dauphin River, the reserve and the non-reserve side formerly known as Anama Bay on adjacent provincial Crown land. The community is at the mouth of the Dauphin River where it enters Sturgeon Bay, a part of Lake Winnipeg. The main portion of the community is 5 kilometres (km) long on the north shore of the river.

Access

The community is approximately 378 km north of Winnipeg and 72 km north of Gypsumville. Provincial Road 513 provides access to Gypsumville and to Provincial Trunk Highway 6.

Governance

The community was recognized in March 1970 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.
