# Incorporated Community of Seymourville

## Community Overview

The community incorporated in 2004 and is one of a group of five in the area including Bissett, Aghaming, Manigotagan and the Hollow Water reserve.

### Access

The community lies on the southeast boundary of the reserve and is 70 kilometres by road from Powerview-Pine Falls.

### Governance

The community is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

The community employs a community administrative officer, public works employee, volunteer fire chief and shares the services of a community safety officer with neighbouring communities.

## Economic Overview

The community is located within the Precambrian shield region of the province an area of granite-gneissic rock with little or no soil cover which has an impact on economic opportunity. A large deposit of silica sand has been identified, but no development has taken place yet. Economic activity includes fishing, trapping, logging, wild rice harvesting and limited

tourism support. Fishers deliver and pack fish in Seymourville and transport to Selkirk or Winnipeg.

The Seymourville Community Development Corporation incorporated August 20, 2003 to assist and support the social and economic needs of the community.

#### Water and Wastewater

Water is drawn from Lake Winnipeg into the pumphouse where a chemical feed treatment plant treats the water and distributes throughout the community by a piped distribution system.

Sewage is collected by a low-pressure sewage line and pumped into a lagoon for treatment.

Seymourville shares a regional solid waste disposal site located on the reserve with Aghaming, Bissett and Manigotagan.
