The Community of Moose Lake resides adjacent to the Mosakihiken Cree Nation and is located on the northern limits of the Saskatchewan River Delta on the western shore of Cedar Lake about 74 km Southeast of The Pas.

The community has been represented since June 1971 by an elected mayor and council under *The Northern Affairs Act*.

Emergency Services

Fire

Fire fighting capability is based on a pumper truck and equipment from the community fire hall. Portable forestry equipment is also available for grass and brush fires.

Police

Police response is from the Moose Lake detachment, RCMP, phone (204) 678-2267.

Medical

Medical response is based upon support from the federal nursing station located on the nearby reserve. The nearest hospital and ambulance is in The Pas. The community qualifies for Patient Air Transport Support.

Water

The Community water treatment plant supplies chlorinated well water to the community by means of a piped system. The areas that are not serviced by piped system have water delivery.

Waste Disposal

The Community solid-waste disposal site is located near the community and is used also by the Mosakihiken Cree Nation.

The reserve and part of the community has sewage collected by piped collection lines going to a lagoon on the outskirts of the community. The areas not serviced by piped system have sewage pumpout to the lagoon.

Schools

Frontier School Division operates the Rod Martin School with a staff of 17 persons. Schooling is provided to both community and reserve residents by an agreement between Frontier School Division and Federal Indian Education. Phone (204) 678-2353.

Economic Overview

The Saskatchewan River Delta and adjoining Cedar Lake provide intensive fishing and wildlife production. Cattle ranching has been practised in the past.

Presently the most notable activity has been through the Moose Lake Loggers. Local residents as well as residents from nearby communities of Cormorant, Cranberry Portage and The Pas are employed.

Commercial fishing provides substantial income to the community and the fish catch is transported to The Pas. Trapping provides additional income and wild rice has been planted on nearby lakes.
