Community Status

Pikwitonei is located along the Hudson Bay Line, operated by Omni Trax, some 304 kilometres by rail Northeast of The Pas and 48 kilometres approximately Southeast of Thompson. The railway provides the only all-weather surface linkage.

Since recognition by Northern Affairs in 1969, the community has a mayor and council under *The Northern Affairs Act* as the governing body.

Emergency Services

Fire

Fire fighting capability is based on a pumper truck and equipment from the community fire hall. Portable forestry equipment is also available for grass and brush fires.

Police

Police response is from the Thompson detachment, RCMP, phone (204) 677-6909.

Medical

Medical response is based upon a local provincial nursing station operated by two nurses aides and supervised by medical staff from Thompson. The nearest hospital is in Thompson. This community may qualify for assistance through the Northern Patient Transportation Program.

Water

Water is obtained from the Pikwitonei River, filtered, chlorinated and distributed to a piped system.

Waste Disposal

A solid-waste disposal site is located near the community and solid-waste is picked up once a week. Businesses must arrange for their own transportation of wastes to the disposal site.

Sewage is piped by low-pressure sewage line to a lagoon located in the community.

Economic Overview

Pikwitonei is located within an area suitable for recreation as well as forestry development. Pockets of clay soils with some suitability for agriculture are also found in the area.

The railway reached Pikwitonei in 1914 and the community served as a division point until 1972. Railway employment is now limited to track maintenance.

The Tolko Manitoba Inc Forestry road and winter roads link the community to the all-weather road network for about six to eight weeks every January and February.

Trapping is a vital economic activity. Commercial fishers harvest on six nearby lakes and deliver fish to the Wabowden fish station. Wild rice has been planted in some of the surrounding area.
