Fishing on Lake Winnipeg was the major source of employment. The Princess Harbour fish station handles the catch from local fishers and the surrounding area. Tourism has also become a large part of the economy with its natural beauty and the recent discovery of centuries old Petroforms (Sacred Spiritual Site of the First Peoples of Turtle Island). There are wildlife and nature tours, as well as sport fishing. Some trapping occurs in the Bloodvein Registered Trapline Zone.


