Community Overview

Waterhen is situated on the east shore of the Waterhen River midway between Waterhen Lake and Lake Manitoba.

Access

The community is located at the intersection of Provincial Road (PR) 328 and PR 276 providing access to Gypsumville due east and Ste. Rose du Lac due south. As a result of these connections, significant traffic flows through to a number of nearby communities, including Skownan First Nation (8 kilometres north), Mallard, Meadow Portage, Salt Point and Homebrook.

The community was recognized in 1970 and is represented by a mayor and council under The Northern Affairs Act.

Water and Wastewater

Water is pumped from the Waterhen River into a 32 million litre reservoir. It is then chlorinated and pumped to standpipes and a limited distribution system. Homes in the subdivision

and Frontier School Division buildings are connected to the distribution line.

Sewage is piped by low pressure sewer lines to a community lagoon. Individual septic services are also available within the community.

Waste Disposal

Solid waste pick-up service is provided and materials are transported to a solid waste disposal site near the community.
