Amendments and Updates Manitoba Security Guard Training Program Participant's Manual

The first review and update of the Manitoba Security Guard Training Program (MSGTP) manual has been completed as of September 30, 2014.

The focus of this review included changes to the *Criminal Code* of Canada as well as amendments to Manitoba's Workplace Safety and Health legislation.

Updates to the MSGTP manual include:

- Updated *Criminal Code* provisions in Unit 3 (You and the Law) and appendices.
- Expanded Unit 3 text explaining changes to the *Criminal Code* and its general impact on citizen's powers of arrest in relation to property.
- Expanded Unit 3 text explaining in more detail individual security guard licensing requirements and responsibilities.
- Updates and additions under appendices for the *Workplace Safety and Health Act* and Regulation.
- Updated Unit 10 (Working Safely) text related to the rights of workers to actively take part in addressing workplace safety and health concerns.
- Updated Unit 10 text regarding Working Alone.

- Updated *Manitoba Human Rights Code* provisions under appendices.
