Agreement to Change Support Obligations

The parties to an order (support payor and support recipient) can change the support obligations in their order for enforcement purposes by completing and submitting an Agreement to Change Support Obligations for either spousal or child support. The Agreement to Change Support Obligations form allows the Maintenance Enforcement Program (MEP) to administer the support as represented in the Agreement. Once the Agreement is received by MEP, the account will be adjusted and the parties notified of the corresponding account adjustments.

Please note that MEP can only give effect to the Agreement if it is fully completed and signed by both parties and the instructions within are clear and enforceable by MEP. The parties will be advised in writing if MEP cannot administer the changes requested in the form.

To change child support obligations being enforced by MEP, please complete and submit the Agreement to Change Child Support Obligations.

To change spousal support obligations being enforced by MEP, please complete and submit the Agreement to Change Spousal Support Obligations.

Terminating a Support Agreement

The Agreement to Change Support Obligations may be terminated in writing by either party by completing and submitting the Termination of Agreement to Change Support Obligations. Upon receiving notice from one or both of the parties, MEP will resume enforcement of the support obligations set out in the prior support order and the parties will be notified in writing of any resulting account adjustments.

An Agreement to Change Support Obligations does not change your court ordered obligations, it only changes the amount that MEP may enforce. To change your court ordered support obligation, it is necessary to vary your order.
