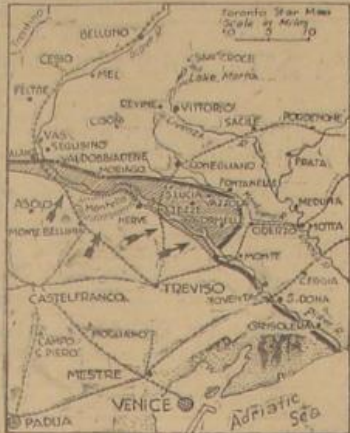

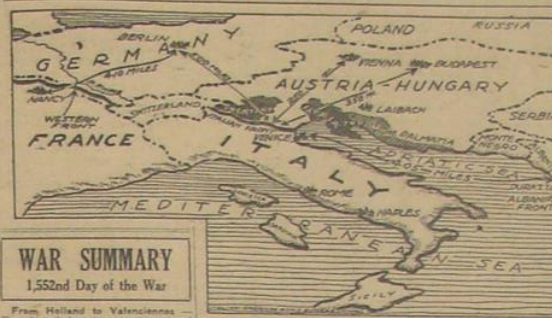

WAR SUMMARY

1,552nd Day of the War

From Holland to Valenciennes—French and American troops entered the third day of their attack between the Ley and the Scheldt, on a front of about 15 miles. They have captured Audenaerde, Dierks, Nassewe and other villages, advanced three miles and taken more than 1,000 prisoners. The Belgians are pushing their positions along the Derivation canal, west of Ghent.

From Valencennes to Looze—The French and Americans under General Gouraud resumed their attack along the Aisne front this morning, taking 1,400 additional prisoners.

From Verdun to Switzerland—No activity.

Italian Front—The allied advance continues on the whole front from the Adige to the Adriatic. The Italians have reached the Tagliamento river and have nearly destroyed the Aquila bridge. The allied line which runs from the Adriatic to the Austrian frontier, where it reaches the Adriatic.

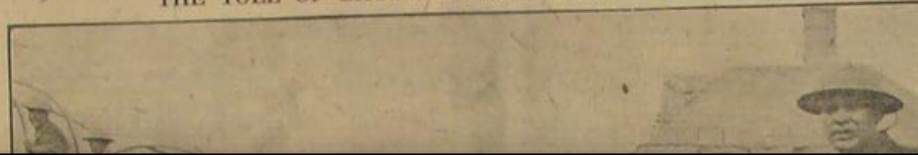

SIX CASES YESTERDAY One Of These From Out Of City—Medical Health Officer Asks People To Be Patient

The situation in Portage in regard to the Spanish Flu is much improved in the past forty-eight hours, that is if the number of cases reported is anything to go by. By this people must not infer that the epidemic is on the wane, neither is it stated officially that the apex has been reached, but it is encouraging to the authorities to know that a fewer number of cases are being found. This is undoubtedly due to the readiness of the people to carry out the instructions of the health officer, and in speaking of the matter this morning Dr. Cowan stated that he would say that the people keep at it, pay attention to everything and for the sake of your neighbor don't be in too big a hurry to get out of quarantine.

Only six cases were reported yesterday. One of these was brought to the hospital from the country, so there were only 5 cases reported from the city. On Saturday there were 28 cases reported, fourteen in the city and a like number at the Training School. This makes a total of 213 cases that have thus far been reported, 150 in the city, 57 at the Training School and 6 at the home. Releases from quarantine cases first reported are now being reported, five being this morning.
