RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding ONE 1.6 HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS for LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY: AMORTIZATION OF CAPITAL ASSETS..... \$153,200.00 for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000. 9.2 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding THREE HUNDRED FIFTY-FIVE MILLION, THREE HUNDRED SEVENTEEN THOUSAND, THREE **HUNDRED DOLLARS for FAMILY SERVICES:** EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME ASSISTANCE \$355,317,300.00 for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000. Resolutions were reported. Report was received and the Committee of Supply obtained leave to sit again.
