PRAYERS

1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

The Clerk formally advised the Assembly that Madam Speaker was unavoidably detained and called upon the Deputy Speaker to take the Chair pursuant to the Statutes. The Deputy Speaker took the Chair at 1:30 p.m.

Mr. SVEINSON, Deputy Chairperson of the Committee of Supply, presented the Report of the Proceedings of the Committee of June 28, 1999 as follows:

IN THE COMMITTEE

The following Resolutions were adopted:

9.1 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding SEVEN MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED NINETY-EIGHT THOUSAND, SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS for FAMILY SERVICES:

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE \$7,498,600.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000.

9.4 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding TWO HUNDRED FOUR MILLION, SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS for FAMILY SERVICES:

CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES \$204,666,200.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000.

9.5 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding THREE MILLION, ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS for FAMILY SERVICES:

AMORTIZATION OF CAPITAL ASSETS..... \$3,177,400.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000.

15.1 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding SIX MILLION, ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED DOLLARS for HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION:

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE \$6,171,700.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000.

15.2 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding SIXTY-ONE MILLION, ONE HUNDRED FORTY-NINE THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS for HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION:

HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMS \$61,149,500.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000.

15.3 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN MILLION, NINE HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED DOLLARS for HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION:

INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS \$167,929,700.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000.

15.4 RESOLVED that there be granted to HER MAJESTY a sum not exceeding THREE MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED NINETY-EIGHT THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS for HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION:

AMORTIZATION OF CAPITAL ASSETS \$3,498,400.00

for the fiscal year ending the 31st day of March, 2000.

Resolutions were reported.

Report was received and the Committee of Supply obtained leave to sit again.

Hon. Mr. FILMON, the First Minister made a statement concerning Farm Aid Package offered to farmers in Manitoba for the unseedable crop land due to high amounts of rainfall this spring,

Ms. WOWCHUK commented on the statement.

During Oral Questions, Mr. ASHTON rose on a point of order regarding comments allegedly spoken by the Honourable First Minister to be unparliamentary and indicated he had imputed unworthy motives,

WHEREUPON Mr. Deputy Speaker informed the House he would take the matter under advisement.

Tuesday, June 29, 1999

Pursuant to Rule 20 (1), Messrs. DOWNEY, HICKES and McALPINE and Ms. BARRETT made Members' Statements.

The Legislative Assembly, at its present session, passed a Bill, which in the name of the Assembly, I present to Your Honour and to which Bill I respectfully request Your Honour's Assent:

(No. 33) – The Special Payment to Certain Dependent Spouses of Deceased Workers Act;

décédés

To this Bill the Royal Assent was announced by the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly as follows:

“In Her Majesty’s Name, His Honour the Lieutenant Governor doth assent to this Bill.”

At 2:35 p.m., His Honour was then pleased to retire.

By unanimous consent, the sequence for consideration of estimates, as outlined in Sessional Paper No. 110 tabled on May 11, 1999, and subsequently amended, was further amended in order that Consumer and Corporate Affairs be considered in the Chamber until 4:00 p.m. followed by Northern Affairs and Finance be considered in Room 255 for Tuesday, June 29, 1999, only.
