In the section of the Committee of Supply sitting in Room 254, on Tuesday, June 27, 2000, considering the estimates of the Department of Consumer and Corporate Affairs, a voice vote was held on a motion, as amended, moved by Mr. PRAZNIK recommending that the Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs refer this matter to outside Legal Counsel; and further, to provide the legal opinion to the committee as soon as complete. Whereupon a counted vote was requested and Members sitting in Room 254 and Room 255 returned to the Chamber. A counted vote was held on the motion, which was defeated (29-16).

RESOLVED that towards making good the Supply to be granted to Her Majesty on account of Certain Expenditures of the Public Service for the Fiscal Year ending the 31st day of March 2001, the sum of Two Billion, Two Hundred Seventy Million, Two Hundred Eighty-Nine Thousand, One Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars (\$2,270,289,138.00), being Thirty-Eight Percent (38%) of the total amount to be voted as set forth in Part A (Operating Expenditure) of the Estimates for the Fiscal Year ending the 31st day of March, 2001, laid before the House at the present Session of the Legislature, be granted out of the Consolidated Fund.
