PRAYER 1:30 O'CLOCK P.M.

On motion of Hon. Mr. SWAN, Bill (No. 25) – The Manitoba Evidence Amendment Act (Scheduling of Criminal Organizations)/Loi modifiant la Loi sur la preuve au Manitoba (établissement d'une liste d'organisations criminelles), was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Mr. McFadyen – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Provincial Government consider immediately providing Revlimid as a choice to patients with Multiple Myeloma and their health care providers in Manitoba through public funding. (N. Peters, R. Graham, B. Poustie and others)

Mr. GRAYDON – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request that the Minister of Education Citizenship and Youth consider removing education funding by school tax or education levies from all property in Manitoba, including commercial property and consider finding a more equitable method of funding education such as general revenue following the constitutional funding of education by the Province of Manitoba. (K. Roseman, M. Falce, D. Mason and others)

Mr. BRIESE – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Infrastructure and Transportation to consider making the installation of traffic lights at the intersection of PTH 16 and PTH 5 North a priority project in order to help protect the safety of the motorists and pedestrians who use it. (M. Wollmann Sr., J. Hofer, E. Wollmann and others)

Mrs. DRIEDGER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Minister of Health to consider rethinking her refusal to allow an ophthalmologist to practice in Swan River and to consider working with the community to provide this service without further delay. (T. Highmoor, L. Highmoor, M. Doucette and others)

Mr. LAMOUREUX – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to consider how important it is to have a medical clinic located in the Weston/Brooklands area. (L. Babiak, M. Stephenson, R. Squires and others)

Mr. BOROTSIK – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to consider proceeding with the cheaper, shorter and more logical east side route, subject to necessary regulatory approvals, to save ratepayers hundreds of millions of dollars during these challenging economic times. (P. Shelvey, D. McFadden, K. Vinthers and others)

Mrs. STEFANSON – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to request the Minister of Conservation to consider acknowledging that more timely action should have been taken to address the shortcomings with the lagoons in the Whiteshell Provincial Park in order to protect the environment and to consider immediately developing short and long-term strategies to address the shortcomings with lagoons in the Whiteshell Provincial Park and to consider implementing them as soon as possible. (M. Pogorzelec, N. Pogorzelec, S. Pogorzelec and others)

Ms. BRICK – Legislative Assembly to amend the Southwood Golf and Country Club Incorporation Act to re-state the terms and conditions applicable to the issue, redemption and holding of shares in the capital stock of the club and to calls on such capital stock; to clarify the purpose of the club; to provide for the application of the Corporations Act to the club; and to make other incidental changes to the Act.
