PRAYER AND LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The following Bill was read a First Time and had its purposes outlined:

(No. 224) – The Budget Bill Public Accountability Act/Loi sur la participation du public quant à la loi budgétaire (Mrs. STONE) Pursuant to sub-rule 28(1), Hon. Min. MOYES, MLA BEREZA, Messrs. OXENHAM and KING and MLA CHEN made Member's statements.

The following petitions were presented and read to the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba:

MLA BEREZA – To urge the Provincial Government to take immediate and decisive action on bail reform to address serious deficits in enforcement by utilizing all available provincial mechanisms to strengthen warrant enforcement, increasing bail supervision, and opposing release of offenders, thus ensuring that repeat violent offenders are held accountable and that public safety is prioritized over leniency; and to lobby the Federal Government to immediately repeal provisions of the Criminal Code that allow for the continued victimization of law-abiding Manitobans while granting repeat offenders additional rights.

Mr. KING – To urge the Provincial Government to take immediate and decisive action on bail reform to address serious deficits in enforcement by utilizing all available provincial mechanisms to strengthen warrant enforcement, increasing bail supervision, and opposing release of offenders, thus ensuring that repeat violent offenders are held accountable and that public safety is prioritized over leniency; and to lobby the Federal Government to immediately repeal provisions of the Criminal Code that allow for the continued victimization of law-abiding Manitobans while granting repeat offenders additional rights.

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MLA BEREZA moved the following Opposition Day motion:

THAT the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba call on the Provincial Government to take immediate and decisive action to create a bail condition enforcement branch within the Manitoba Sheriff's Department to protect and safeguard Manitobans from individuals that violate conditions of their release.

And MLA BEREZA and Hon. Mr. WIEBE having spoken,

And, by leave, Hon. Mr. WIEBE moved an amendment as follows:

THAT the motion be amended by striking out all of the words after "THAT" and replacing that text with:

the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba call on the Provincial Government to take immediate and decisive action to further enhance bail enforcement within law enforcement agencies to protect and safeguard Manitobans from individuals that violate conditions of their release.

WHEREUPON the Speaker ruled the amendment in order,

And Mr. KING, MLA PANKRATZ, Mr. BALCAEN, Hon. Min. CABLE, Messrs. EWASKO and WASYLIW, MLA LAMOUREUX and Mmes. HIEBERT and COOK having spoken,
