DEBATE ON GOVERNMENT MOTION:

Hon. Min. FONTAINE - Special Committee on Local Journalism

THAT a Special Committee on Local Journalism be created to make recommendations on exploring the future of local journalism, including rural and cultural media such as French, Filipino, Punjabi and Chinese language publications, with the mandate to consider matters of public support for journalism, and report its conclusion to the Assembly within 30 days of the start of Fall Sitting 2025; and

THAT the composition of the Special Committee be:

- (a) four members designated by the NDP caucus, and
- (b) two members designated by the PC caucus; and

THAT the Special Committee be authorized to decide how it will conduct its business, including deciding to hold meetings at times and places it considers advisable to receive briefs and hear presentations; and

THAT, except as otherwise provided in this motion, the Special Committee shall have the same status and powers and follow the same rules and procedures as a Standing Committee of the House, including the power to establish a sub-committee for the purposes of carrying out any part of the Special Committee's work; and

THAT after adoption by the House, this motion may be amended only by:

- (a) unanimous consent of the House;
- (b) passage of a subsequent motion by the House; or
- (c) written agreement of all House Leaders if the House is not sitting.

And the Proposed Motion of Mr. JOHNSON in amendment thereto as follows:

THAT the first clause of the Motion be deleted and the following substituted as the new first clause:

THAT a Special Committee on Local Journalism be created to make recommendations on exploring the future of local journalism, including rural and cultural media representing all ethnicities and non-official languages, so long as they do not promote hate speech or undermine the Manitoba values of inclusivity and respect for all races, religions, and backgrounds, with the mandate to consider matters of public support for journalism, and report its conclusion to the Assembly within 30 days of the start of Fall Sitting 2025; and (Mr. SCHULER – 13 minutes)

WHEREAS the Sub-Committee, following an open competition and consideration of applicants, recommended to the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs that Leigh Anne Caron be appointed Seniors' Advocate; and

WHEREAS the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs recommends the same to the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to section 2 of *The Seniors' Advocate Act*, Leigh Anne Caron be appointed as the Seniors' Advocate effective November 12, 2025.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION:

Mr. WASYLIW - Manitoba Needs to Address the Cost of Living Crisis

21. WHEREAS the Province of Manitoba has lost 5,000 jobs in the month of August; and

WHEREAS Manitoba continues to lead the country in the fastest growing grocery store prices; and

WHEREAS Manitoba has the fastest growing rents in the country despite being a rent-controlled province; and

WHEREAS Manitoba has the third lowest minimum wage in the country; and

WHEREAS one in four working Manitobans, or 170,000 people, earn less than a living wage and are overwhelmingly women with young children and/or newcomers to Manitoba; and

WHEREAS the Provincial Government continues to ignore the rising costs of public transit and add to the financial burden of parents who already pay exorbitant fees for private childcare, by increasing tuition on students and underfunding public education.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Assembly of Manitoba urge the Provincial Government to immediately reduce the costs of living for Manitobans by creating a plan which will reduce the costs of rental housing, groceries, public transit, and public school fees, and will also bring in a tuition freeze for post-secondary students and provide for the immediate building of new childcare spaces.
