Objectives :	Students will gain an appreciation of the stories behind the monuments located on the grounds of the Manitoba Legislative Building Students will make a connection between these monuments/people and the formation and development of Manitoba and Canada Students will do research, and will practice public speaking

Activating

- View "A Day in the Life of the House" video series
- Look at the monument slides as a class
- Have students form groups of two, and choose one of the monuments to research and present to their class

Acquiring

- Discuss the video series as a class
- Allow research time for groups to gather information about their selected monuments

Applying

- Place students in groups of 5 and have them complete the grounds scavenger hunt upon arrival at the Legislative Building. Give correct answers and prizes to those who complete it correctly
- Have students complete the guided tour (Legislative Grounds tour based on availability, must be pre-booked with Visitor Tour office)
- Alternatively, have student groups complete the self-guided grounds tour along with the scavenger hunt
- Have students attend a session in the Classroom in the Legislature (sessions in the Legislative Classroom must be pre-booked with the Education and Outreach Services Office)
- Upon returning to school, have groups present information on their monument to the class

Assessing

- On-site verbal questions as the why the individual was important to Manitoba, and why their statue may be on the Legislative Building grounds
- In-class quiz on the scavenger hunt information
- In-class quiz on the chosen monuments after groups present their monument to the class
- Exit slip asking students what they learned, and what their favorite fact of the day was. Can also ask what else they would like to learn about the Legislative Building.
