HIGHLIGHTS

This week's releases include average weekly earnings and population estimates.

Manitoba's total population was estimated at 1,409,223 residents as of July 1, 2022, up by 17,244 people, or 1.24%, compared to July 2021.

Average weekly earnings increases

Not adjusting for seasonality, Manitoba average weekly earnings are up 3.7% compared to July 2021. Retail trade experienced the largest increase at 12.0%, while wholesale trade experienced the largest decrease, down by 7.1%, over the same period.

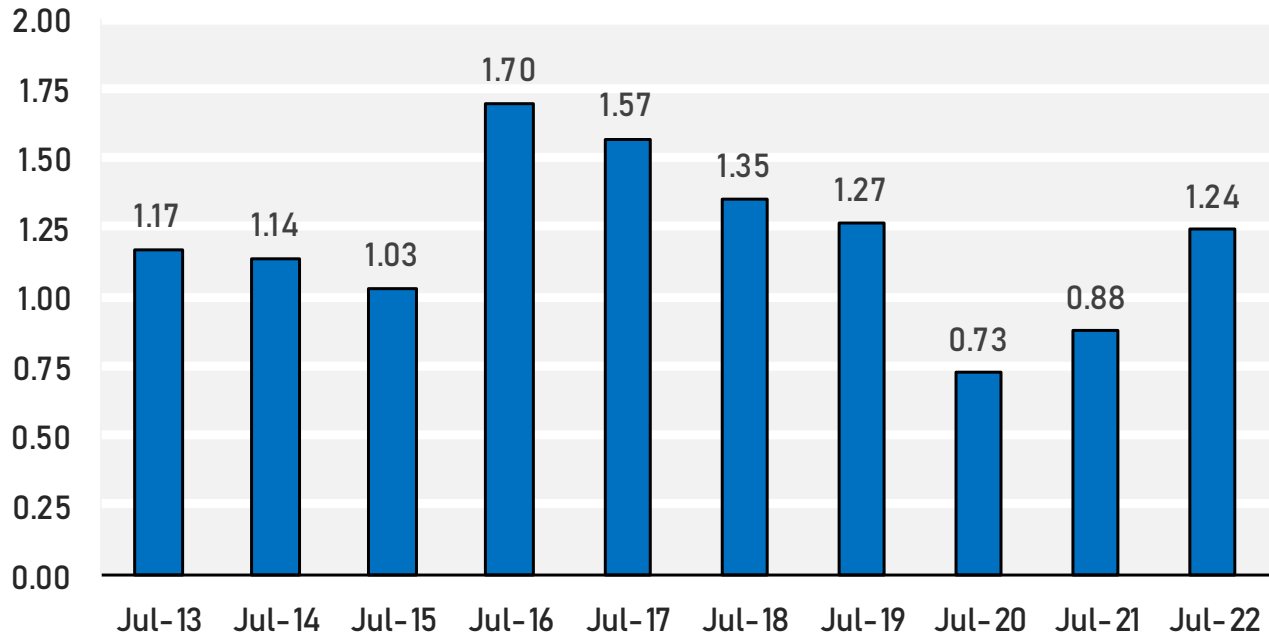
Manitoba's seasonally adjusted average weekly earnings in July were \$1,054.32. This is down 0.1% from June, and 3.1% greater than last July.

Nationally, average weekly earnings for July are \$1,163.23, which is up 0.4% from June, and 2.9% greater than last July.

Population growth rates approaching pre-pandemic levels

Manitoba's total population was estimated at 1,409,223 residents as of July 1, 2022, up by 17,244 people, or 1.24%, compared to July 2021. Although Manitoba's twelve-month immigration levels are the highest on record, net interprovincial outflows not seen since 1989/90 hamper growth. Over the twelve months ending June 30, 2022, Manitoba had a gain of 20,084 residents through net international migration, however this is partially offset by a net loss to other provinces and territories of 10,203 people.

Manitoba's total population increased by 7,256 individuals from the April 1, 2022 estimate. With a quarterly growth rate of 0.52%, Manitoba ranks ninth compared to other provinces and below Canada's 0.74% increase.

Effective with this release, Statistics Canada introduced revisions to its population estimates relative to previously published levels. The net effect of the revisions for Manitoba is an increase in population of 8,788 individuals, fueled by a decrease in the net loss of persons to other provinces.
